Two dozen tales in which vampires make their presence felt, written by authors from the nineteenth century to contemporary writers such as Anne Rice, Steven King, Joyce Carol Oates, John Cheever, and Woody Allen.
- F F216 **Fantaskey, Beth. Jessica's Guide to Dating on the Dark Side.** 1st ed. New York : Harcourt, 2009.
Seventeen-year-old Jessica, adopted and raised in Pennsylvania, learns that she is descended from a royal line of Romanian vampires and that she is betrothed to a vampire prince, who poses as a foreign exchange student while courting her.
- F H148L **Hahn, Mary Downing. Look for Me by Moonlight.** New York : Clarion, c1995.
While staying at the remote and reputedly haunted Maine inn run by her father and pregnant stepmother, sixteen-year-old Cynda feels increasingly isolated from her father's new family and finds solace in the attentions of a charming but mysterious guest.

Fifteen-year-old vampire Nina has been stuck for fifty-one years in a boring support group for vampires, and nothing exciting has ever happened to them--until one of them is murdered and the others must try to solve the crime.

Two years after a horrible incident made them run away, vampire princess Lissa and her guardian-in-training Rose are found and returned to St. Vladimir's Academy, where they face new and terrifying enemies. The other...

Vladimir's Academy, where one focuses on mastering magic, the other on physical training, while both try to avoid the perils of gossip, cliques, gruesome pranks, and sinister plots.

Although eighteen-year-old Bella joins the dark but seductive world of the immortals by marrying Edward the vampire, her connection to the powerful werewolf Jacob remains unsevered.
- F M613e **Meyer, Stephenie. Eclipse.** 1st ed. New York : Little, Brown, 2007.
Bella must choose between her friendship with Jacob and her relationship with Edward, both vampires, but when Seattle is ravaged by a mysterious string of killings, the three of them need to decide whether their personal lives are more important than the well-being of an entire city.
- F M613n **Meyer, Stephenie. New Moon.** 1st ed. New York : Little, Brown and Co., 2006.
When the Cullens, including her beloved Edward, leave Forks rather than risk revealing that they are vampires, it is almost too much for eighteen-year-old Bella to bear, but she finds solace in her friend Jacob until he is drawn into a "cult" and changes in terrible ways.

When seventeen-year-old Bella leaves Phoenix to live with her father in Forks, Washington, she meets an exquisitely handsome boy at school for whom she feels an overwhelming attraction and who she comes to realize is not wholly human.

An evil count in Transylvania leads an army of human vampires that prey on people.
- F R328v **Rees, Douglas. Vampire High.** New York : Delacorte Press;, 2003.
When his family moves from California to New Sodom, Massachusetts, and Cody enters Vlad Dracul Magnet School, many things seem strange, from the dark-harried, pale-skinned, supernaturally strong students to Charon, the wolf who guides him around campus on the first day.
- F S378 **Schreiber, Ellen. Vampire Kisses.** 1st ed. New York, N.Y. : HarperCollins Pub., c2003.
Sixteen-year-old Raven, an outcast who always wears black and hopes to become a vampire some day, falls in love with the mysterious new boy in town, eager to find out if he can make her dreams come true.

After traveling with Mr. Crepsley, the vampire who made him into a half-vampire, Darren returns to the freak show known as the Cirque du Freak and continues to fight his need to drink human blood.

In a world where vampires are a majority, a bored vampire decides to raise a young human who escaped from the hunting preserve.
